Subject: Open letter regarding Mr. Julian Assange – a matter of life and death!

Your Excellency,

We are reaching out to you regarding the imminent hearing at the High Courts of Justice in London on 20 and 21 February 2024 to determine Mr. Assange's right to appeal. As concerned citizens from Austria, we advocate for democratic principles, the rule of law, human rights, freedom of information, free speech and for a free press.

We, the undersigned, represent the Austrian Journalists Club, the biggest independent journalist association and communication platform for media-people in Austria. Since its foundation in 1977, the Austrian Journalist Club holds high the right of the freedom of the press and the right of true information for everybody, free of political or economic influences whatsoever. Undersigning with us are also representatives of Candles4Assange, a group in Vienna holding weekly vigils for Julian Assange's freedom since January 9, 2020. We share the concern that his prosecution is a potential threat to global journalism and publishing.

Mr. Assange's work with WikiLeaks has undoubtedly contributed to public awareness of not only government and military actions and of potential misconduct, but also to shedding light on other matters of global significance (be they by individuals, corporations or governments and their various sections), and holding power to account. His prolonged imprisonment, exceeding 13 years, raises serious concerns about human rights violations.

In 2016, the UN Working Group on Arbitrary Detention called for Mr. Assange's release, including his entitlement to compensation. Despite this, he remained under various forms of detention until now when he is facing extradition to the United States.

The extradition trial, labelled by many as a "show trial", and the procedures that followed, overlooked crucial evidence, including perjury by a key witness and CIA plots against Mr. Assange's life. The decision to extradite him, based on assurances from the US, disregarded the potential dangers he faces, both in pretrial procedures and within the US legal system.



Notably, former UN Special Rapporteur on Torture, Nils Melzer, concluded that Mr. Assange is a victim of torture and should be set free. We have also noted that Dr. Alice Jill Edwards, the current UN Special Rapporteur on Torture urged the Government of the United Kingdom on 6 February to halt the possible extradition of Julian Assange to the United States.

As the hearing approaches, we urge your intervention to address the following human rights concerns:

- 1. Disregard of the decision of the UN Working Group on Arbitrary Detention.
- 2. Prolonged imprisonment in the high-security Prison of Belmarsh.
- 3. Judiciary decisions seemingly influenced by political motives.

We appeal for a fair resolution on 20 and 21 February 2024 and, ultimately a dismissal of the case, no extradition to the US, and the return of Julian Assange to his home country, Australia, and a cessation of all types of persecution. Thank you for your kind attention to this critical matter.
